Plenary Speaker: Dr. Darla K. Deardorff

Session 1: *Developing Intercultural Communication: Introduction to Story Circles*

(Time: 8:00 AM. – 8:30 AM.) This session will be post-recorded and available on our Private YouTube Channel.

Intercultural competence is necessary in a globalized yet polarized world where we see increasing threats to human rights and even to human existence. Such intercultural skills are key to developing successful communication and exchange as we learn to live together. Yet, what are ways to develop intercultural competence? This session introduces an intercultural methodology piloted around the world by the United Nations (UNESCO) called Story Circles. This methodology, used both in-person as well as virtually, has been quite successful in bringing people together across differences and provides a way for people to come together to learn from each other as they practice key intercultural skills.

Session 2: *Exploring Story Circles in Depth*

(Time: 12:30 PM. - 2:00 PM.) This session is not recorded.

Story Circles bring people together into a situation of community where, based on the Story Circle process, everyone is respected and is considered equal and where participants are able to share more about themselves or a circumstance by telling their own stories based on their life experience. Story Circles provide a way for people from different backgrounds to come together to learn from each other and to explore cultural similarities and differences. The role of facilitators in Story Circles is to introduce the process, provide instructions on the process, to organize the participants into small groups, to be available if any questions or issues arise while small groups are engaged in the Story Circle process, and to facilitate the debrief of the experience. Intercultural skills are necessary in a globalized world where we see increasing threats to human rights. They are key to developing skills to make communication and exchange possible among the many different actors involved.

Biography:

Dr. Darla K. Deardorff is a widely published author with 8 books and over 60 book chapters and articles. She is currently executive director of the Association of International Education Administrators (AIEA) and has worked in the international education field for over thirty years. In addition, she is a research fellow at Duke University, and holds faculty appointments at numerous institutions around the world including at Nelson Mandela University (South Africa), York University (Canada), Meiji University (Japan), and Shanghai International Studies University (China). She has also been faculty at Harvard University's Future of Learning Institute and Global Education Think Tank, as well as the Summer Institute for Intercultural Communication. Founding president of the World Council on Intercultural and Global Competence, she is an experienced ESL teacher and cross-cultural trainer and has lived, taught, and worked in Germany, Japan, China, Thailand, and Switzerland.

A recipient of numerous awards, she edited the *SAGE Handbook of Intercultural Competence* (2009), co-authored *Beneath the Tip of Iceberg* (an ESL textbook from University of Michigan Press, 2011), and co-edited the *SAGE Handbook of International Higher Education* (2012), and *Building Cultural Competence: Innovative Activities and Models* (Stylus 2012), and the open – access *Manual for Developing Intercultural Competencies: Story Circles* (UNESCO/Routledge, 2020), among others.
